


Governor's Proposed Budget

Governor's Proposed Budget

Presented March 7, 2023

Additional highlights:

- \$100M state appropriation for school environmental repairs and improvements
- School Food Services Initiative: \$38.5M increase to both annualize Gov. Wolf's 2022/23 universal free breakfast initiative and expand free lunch to students previously only eligible for reduced price lunches
- Continued School Safety investments
 - Maintains the \$100MTransfer to the School Safety and Security Fund for physical safety grants
 - Creates a \$100M school-based mental health supports block grant (distribution unknown)

Governor's Proposed Budget

Presented March 7, 2023

Additional highlights:

- CTE: \$17.3M increase (16%)
 - \$3.3M, or 60%, more for equipment grants
 - \$3M to cover enrollment growth and \$4M to increase the subsidy rate
 - \$5M to develop additional CTE programs statewide
 - \$2M for an initiative to bring more trade and industry professionals into the classroom
- \$1M increase within Adult and Family Literacy to make the high school equivalency exam free of charge
- \$10.4M increase (3%) for Early Intervention
- \$30M increase (10%) for PreK Counts
- \$2.7M increase (3%) for HeadStart Supplemental Assistance
