Intensive Behavioral Health Services

Assisting children with developing socially appropriate behaviors that will maximize their potential, independence, and healthy relationships.

- From birth to age 20.
- For adolescents who have a behavioral or mental health condition with an identified DSM/ICD-10 diagnosis.
- Most commercial insurance plans and Medicaid are accepted
- Services are provided by behavioral health technicians, behavior specialists, mobile therapists, and Board-Certified Behavior Analysts.
- Facilitates stronger collaboration between schools, families, and community-based services.
- Serves as a bridge between in-school and out-of-school support

Preschool Special Education Services

Ensuring every preschool child is on track to success by providing free screenings for speech, language, fine and gross motor skills, vision, and hearing.

- From ages 3 to 5.
- An evaluation will be done with parental approval
- An Individualized Education Program (IEP) is developed and services are arranged.
- Services support cognition, communication, social and emotional, adaptive and motor skills.
- An expert staff dedicated to helping preschoolers reach their potential.
- Free of charge for children and families who reside in Chester County or in a Chester County school district that qualifies for special education services.

Frequently Asked Questions	Intensive Behavioral Health Services	Preschool Special Education Services
What is the difference between the programs?	IBHS focuses on behavioral support and skill acquisition and is funded through insurance	PSE is a free service that focuses on the educational needs of students who qualify
What is my responsibility as a parent for these services?	Making phone calls, attending assessments and meetings, being in the home for home visits, participating in therapy as needed	Attending assessments and meetings. If services are at a PSE location, parents will need to transport to the therapy session
Where are services provided?	Home, school, and community	Community preschool, CCIU locations or PSE classroom if you qualify for the classroom
How long does it take to receive services?	Depends on the availability of staff	60-90 days from when the Permission to Evaluate is signed by a parent
What do I need to do prior to services being provided?	Provide demographic and insurance information, complete admission documents, schedule a 30–60-minute Telehealth appointment with a diagnostician	Call a PSE secretary to answer demographic questions and questions about concerns, communicate with a Service Coordinator, attend an evaluation with your child. If a child qualifies, then an IEP meeting will be scheduled. Sign all paperwork required.
